A meeting of the Hepworth Parish Council took place on Thursday 6 th September 2018 at the village hall where the following items were discussed.

Members of the Public: There were 3 members of the public present


- 1. Apologies Mr A Yorke (Vice Chairman), Mrs M MacPherson, Mrs R Vernon, Mr G Bloomfield
- 2. Declarations of Interest There were none
- 3. Minutes of previous meetings The minutes of the Meeting 5 th July 2018 and Extraordinary Meetings of 2 nd August 2018 and 24 th August 2018 were agreed and signed.
- 4. Matters arising from previous meetings Trees at Willow Green information awaited from residents
- 5. Receive reports and hear from members of the public present Report from Cllr Spicer
- •Flooding not top priority for County Council, properties at risk of flooding top priority. It is on the list to be done
- •The CC has agreed to replace the 40 mph VAS on the A143.
- •The Public Enquiry Footpaths took place on 14 th August. The decision is pending. Footpath Market Weston Road Highways Engineer has inspected the site and the CC will give permission for volunteers to work on the highways and clear the path. There may be a small grant available towards costs.
- •Report from Cllr Bull
- •Funds are available to support the Parish Council 'Battles Over' event on November 11 th
- •Following the creation of the new West Suffolk Council in April 2019, after 2021 the council may be charged for Playground Inspections, which are currently free of charge.
- •A parishioner has complained that after her regular voluntary litter picks the black bags are not collected. Cllr Bull to investigate and request collection.
- •Complaints have been received about Diversion and Road Closed signs on The Street, have not being collected after completion of works 3 months ago. Clerk to follow up.
- •Members of the Public
- •The Editor of the Hepworth Herald asked to speak with regard to Editorial restrictions on the content of the magazine. He requested some leeway be given. Agreement was given in principal.
- •A request to be sent to Cllr Bull for £100 to assist with setting up costs.
- •The Chairman thanked Ms Clare Jones-Davies for her regular volunteer litter picks.

#### **July 2018**

Exceptionally hot, dry and sunny. The warmest month of any in my record (2009) and the maximum temp. of 36.2C on the 27th was another record for this station and probably rivalling the summer temperatures of 1976, 1995, 2003 and 2006. The nights, although warm, were comparatively cool compared to local towns and cities. One of the benefits of living in a rural location. The absence of rain throughout most of June continued in to July up to the 26th. (47 consecutive days of no measurable rain). After the great heat of the 27th came severe thunderstorms with frequent lightning on that evening and 24.3mm of rain. In fact the month's total rainfall (36.4mm) fell between the 27th and 30th. Some stats for July: Average daily Max. Temperature: 27.9C. 24 days it reached 25.0C or above, 10 of those were 30.0C or above. An unprecedented month for daytime heat, caused by excessive dryness of the ground leading to very rapid heating by the strong sunshine.

#### August 2018

The heat and sunshine of July continued for the first 7 days of August with a daily average maximum of 30.5C. From the 8th onwards, daytime temperatures gradually fell back to 'normal' August levels with rain and showers returning, although it was still quite sunny. The last 8 days of the month were rather cool for August with a wet Bank Holiday Sunday and a Min. temperature of 6.4C on the 31st. Overall, rainfall was slightly below average for August.

We are a friendly collective of villagers who, on an ad hoc basis, come together to put on village events. We also are here to support others who want to independently put on village events. We can provide people- power, experience and bags of

enthusiasm. Every now and then, we come up with an idea and after a planning get-together, an event is born! In 2018 we have arranged or supported a whole host of events:

Events this year began with a traditional **Burns Night Supper** - complete with delicious Haggis (an alternative provided for vegetarians and for those who can't stand Haggis!), Neeps and Tatties with Clare's whisky sauce, Tipsy Laird Trifle and Cheeses and Scottish Oatcakes followed the main course. All washed down with a favourite tipple or two! A few brave people whisked away the calories by dancing flings and Gay Gordons!

In April, A delicious **Fish and Chip Supper** and afterwards a whole host of traditional pub games – organised by Maureen and Ron Bacon, and supported in whatever way we could. The **Scarecrow Festival and Strawberry Tea** in June was extremely well supported and our thanks to everyone who entered into the spirit of the weekend. As we came up with the idea quite late, it was quite a tight timetable. Fantastic 'Hepworthians' produced some amazingly creative Scarecrows which adorned many of Hepworth front gardens. Definitely something we would like to repeat.

In July, Maureen and Ron Bacon coordinated and arranged the **Flower Festival** in St Peter's Church with a little support from their H2E friends and the art club.

We then tried something completely different! **The Best Exotic Hepworth Pavilion** in August proved hot in many ways! On a glorious summer's evening, the Pavilion was transformed with everything Indian – from exotic wall hangings to colourful table cloths and runners and brightly coloured garlands. A variety of curries were served together with Dahl, Rice, Poppadums, and Naan and followed by Best Exotic Fruit Salad and cream. A hugely successful event and we

have had many requests for a repeat next year.
