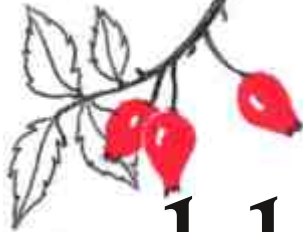

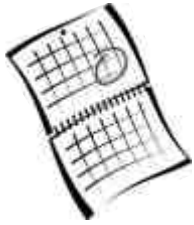

TRAVELS DOWNUNDER - A REMINISCENCE

Part 9

After traversing The Great Ocean Road, our travellers have just caught a ferry across Australia's longest river, The Murray

After stopping for a couple of nights in Victor Harbour it was just a short trip up to Adelaide. A lot of people seem to regard Adelaide as the cultural capital of Australia. It certainly has a lot of really nice buildings which to us seemed to be very European in appearance, especially the University buildings. We were lucky, again, to be in the right place at the right time as the Adelaide Festival was on whilst we were there. It is similar to the Edinburgh Festival with lots of cultural events happening, and like Edinburgh it also has a Fringe, which we took advantage of. Adelaide has a very Mediterranean climate but can get quite cold in winter, but we were there in March so it was the tail end of summer and very pleasant.

From Adelaide we continued to follow the coast north to Port Augusta, very industrialised, where we took a diversion and headed inland up towards the Flinders Ranges. Just north of the town of Hawker there is a geographic feature called Wilpena Pound which is an area encircled by mountains with only one way in or out. It is very scenic and has some great walking tracks and climbs.

Returning to Port Augusta we again followed the coast via Port Lincoln and Ceduna before embarking upon what we were advised would be the most boring part of our trip, crossing the Nullarbor Plain. The Nullarbor, Latin for no trees, is, as its name implies, a massive featureless area, totally flat and with only scrub vegetation. It takes two full days of hard driving to cross it and includes Australia's longest stretch of straight road, the aptly named "90 mile straight". There really is not even a hint of a bend for the whole 90 miles, and with no scenery to look at drivers need to take care not to nod off! Across the length of the Nullarbor there are a few roadhouses along the way where you can get essential supplies and fuel, and at the aptly named Border Village, you cross over from South Australia into Western Australia, the country's largest state.

From the Benefice - Andrew Bladen A church Lay Elder

We are approaching holiday season again, perhaps a time to go away, or to simply holiday at home, perhaps taking time to go to the beach or simply to go out for walks. Taking time out every now and again is a good thing and we all need a break of some kind.

Now, I wonder when you last had a Mars bar? No- I haven't gone off subject, but in thinking about work-life balance - I had a sudden flashback to the old television adverts for Mars - 'A Mars a day helps you work, rest and play'. This was a fabulous slogan first adopted for the chocolate bar in the 1960s, dropped in 1997 but re-introduced briefly ten years later. The premise of the advert was that eating a Mars bar 'aided exercise', which the nutritionalists amongst us might take dispute with, but nevertheless, the original slogan has remained memorable.

We all need work, rest and play, and getting the balance right is important for our physical and mental health. None of us can go flat out at work without risking 'burn- out' and none of us can just rest without losing the ability to move and be productive, and if life was just play I'm not sure what we might achieve in life. But many of us find it difficult to get the balance right.

And what about our spiritual wellbeing? How often do we consider our spiritual needs? I wonder if we are achieving the right balance there, or just ignoring our spiritual needs completely?

Getting the right balance in our lives is important for our overall well-being. Time out or a break of some kind helps to restore that balance.

As a Christian I like the fact that Jesus knew how to find space and time, he often withdrew to 'just be', to connect with God and to pray. He knew the importance of getting the balance right and in doing so was better equipped for life and better equipped to be there for others too, helping them to find inner peace and rest. HEPWORTH PARISH COUNCIL - MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

HEPWORTH PAVILION - THURSDAY 16 JUNE 2022@7.30 PM

PRESENT: Councillor Nicholas Bennett (NB) (Chair), Councillor Perry Penn (PP), Councillor Justin Seldis (JS), Councillor Helen Corris (HC),

IN ATTENDANCE: Christopher Garman (Parish Clerk) (CG), District Councillor Carol Bull (CB)

Two members of public were present.

22/083 PUBLIC FORUM: Concerns were raised by two members of public about the speed of vehicles along The Street and in particular at the south end on the bends towards the A143. There were examples of a number of near misses caused by vehicles traveling at an inappropriate speed. NB explained the situation so far with the traffic calming project, the challenges and determination to get appropriate measures in place in a timely fashion.

22/084 REPORTS FROM AND QUESTIONS TO BOTH DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

a) County Councillor Joanna Spicer was not present.

b) CB gave an update in respect of Blacksmiths Cottage, The Street, Hepworth, the planning application in respect of the glamping pods at North Common, Hepworth, payment of the £150 council tax refunds and the availability of funding for projects through the new UK Prosperity Fund.

22/085 APOLOGIES: Councillor Garry Bloomfield (GB), Councillor Robin Shackleton (RS), Councillor Marjorie MacPherson (MM) and Councillor Louise Robinson (LR) had offered their apologies and these were accepted. County Councillor Joanna Spicer (JSp) had also sent her apologies.

22/086 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST: None.

22/087 REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS: None.

22/088 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: Minutes of the meeting held on 19 May 2022 had been previously circulated. It was resolved that these were an accurate record of the meeting.

22/089 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES: None.

22/090 VILLAGE ASSETS, TREES AND HIGHWAYS:

a) The traffic calming project had been discussed during the public forum. It was noted that without an update from JSp and details of the revised scheme, there was little to be discussed.

b) It was noted that the ROW Weston Lane was now formally closed until such time as it can be resurfaced.

c) The provision of a bike track with ramps was considered. JS had made a visit to a similar facility and it was thought many of the challenges could be overcome. It was decided to formally ask Hepworth Recreation Ground to consider making available an area for such a facility.

22/091 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

a) The following payments were considered for approval: £301.32 to Shelbourne Reynolds Engineering Ltd – repairs to railings; £85.00 to M Saunders – audit fee; £288.00 to Castle Capers Ltd – bouncy castle; £250.00 to Parochial Church Council of Hepworth – donation; £150.00 to SARS – donation; £389.99 to L Robinson – reimbursement for cost of bench; £400.00 to R Shackleton – reimbursement for Mick the Baker fee. It was resolved to approve these payments.

b) The appointment of the Responsible Financial Officer was considered. It was resolved to re-appoint Christopher Garman as Responsible Financial Officer.

c) The Asset Register at 31 March 2022 had been previously circulated and was considered. It was resolved to approve this Asset Register.

d) The audited Annual Statement of Accounts for the year ending 31 March 2022 which had been previously circulated were considered. It was resolved to approve this Annual Statement of Accounts.

e) The Annual Governance Statement 2021/2022 (section 1 of Annual Return 2021/2022) had been previously circulated and was considered. It was resolved to approve this Annual Governance Statement.

f) The Annual Accounting Statement 2021/2022 (section 2 of the Annual Return 2021/2022) had been previously circulated and was considered. It was resolved to approve the Annual Accounting Statement.

g) The completion of the Certificate of Exemption dispensing with the need for an external

audit was considered. It was resolve to complete the Certificate of Exemption.

22/092 PLANNING MATTERS: None.

22/093 CORRESPONDENCE: Correspondence which had been previously circulated was considered and no further action was needed.

22/094 QUESTIONS TO THE CHAIRMAN

a) NB advised that CEAP training was being organised with neighbouring parish councils and that a request would be forthcoming to cover part of the expenses of this training.

b) There was discussion on the way forward with the traffic calming project and the formation of a formal strategic plan to ensure the best appropriate scheme was delivered. This is to be added to the agenda for the next meeting.

22/095 DATE OF NEXT MEETING: The next Parish Council meeting which will be on Thursday 21 July 2022 at 7.30 pm.

The meeting closed at 8.35 pm.

IN ATTENDANCE: Christopher Garman (Parish Clerk) (CG), Nine members of public were present.

22/096 PUBLIC FORUM

a) There were concerns raised about the proposed development at Shepherds Grove Industrial Estate and the environmental impact of the proposed development and the impact on surrounding roads and in particular with the A143 and The Street, Hepworth.

b) There were questions asked about the proposed traffic calming project and the current situation with the proposed revised scheme was explained.

22/097 REPORTS FROM AND QUESTIONS TO BOTH DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

a) County Councillor Joanna Spicer was not present and an email from her was read about the traffic calming project and the resurfacing of Weston Lane.

b) District Councillor Carol Bull was not present.

22/098 APOLOGIES County Councillor Joanna Spicer (JSp) had sent her apologies. Councillor Carol Bull (CB) had planned to be at the meeting but was delayed elsewhere.

22/099 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST None.

22/100 REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS None.

22/101 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING The minutes of the meeting held on 16 June 2022 had been previously circulated. It was resolved that these were an accurate record of the meeting.

22/102 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES None.

22/103 VILLAGE ASSETS, TREES AND HIGHWAYS

a) GB gave an update on the current situation with the traffic calming project following a recent conversation with JSp. There was discussion about the situation and the information gained from the Freedom of Information request and the recent traffic survey. It was recognised that the original scheme was probably not justified or achievable but there was frustration with the time taken to look at a revised scheme. It was noted that JSp was meeting with the SCC officer to look at a revised scheme on 9 August and some parish councillors will try and meet with them. The way forward was considered. It was resolved to have an extra ordinary meeting after 9 August visit to consider the way forward with a request that JSp be present on Thursday 25 August 2022 at 7.30 pm.

b) JSp had suggested in emails that she was on the case of the resurfacing Weston Lane but there was no indication of what would be happening and when. JSp would be asked to keep

focus on this situation with the view to getting this right of way reopened fully soon.

c) There was an update on the Quiet Lanes Suffolk project from MM. It was noted that after just meeting deadlines the project was still in Wave 4 and was now going through the legal process.

d) The provision of a bike track with ramps was considered. MM reported that the Hepworth Recreation Ground committee has considered the request to allocate some land for this project. However, there was doubt as to whether the land needed would fit with having the football pitch. Hepworth Recreation Ground will be asked to revisit the request now there was a better understanding of what is needed. LR suggested there should be a consultation of village youngsters to get an understanding of needs.

22/104 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

a) The following payments were considered for approval. £159.98 to C Garman – Clerk’s expenses April to June 2022 22.80 to SALC – payroll costs. It was resolved to approve these payments.

b) The revised Code of Conduct was considered. It was resolved to adopt the revised Code of Conduct.

22/105 PLANNING MATTERS

a) Planning consultation DC/22/0987/EIASCO relating to Shepherds Grove Industrial Estate East, Sumner Road, Hepworth was considered together with the response by County Councillor Jessica Fleming which had been previously circulated. It was resolved to respond to WSC with the same response but including specific concerns about the impact of increased traffic on the roads of Hepworth.

b) There was an update on the planning application relating the land to the rear of 7 The Street, Hepworth.

22/106 CORRESPONDENCE

a) The email from WSC about an audit of street lighting was discussed.

b) Other correspondence which had been previously circulated was considered and no further action was needed.

22/107 QUESTIONS TO THE CHAIRMAN

a) There was discussion about organising the repairs to the culvert and clearing the drain under the bus shelter. It was suggested a working party will be organised for Saturday 24 September 2022 to undertake this work.

b) It was noted that visibility at the junction of The Street and the A143 in Hepworth was poor due to hedge growth. CG was asked to contact the landowner.

c) PP reported that the willow tree on Willow Green was still on the radar and should be done shortly.

d) NB asked for the costs for the ECAP training to be added to the next agenda for approval.

e) It was noted that help was needed for the recharging and replacing the batteries in the SID. A request will be put in the Hepworth Herald.

22/108 DATE OF NEXT MEETING The next Parish Council meeting which will be on Thursday 15 September 2022 at 7.30 pm. Also, it is planned to have an extra ordinary meeting Thursday 25 August 2022 but this is subject to JSp being available.

The meeting closed at 9.40 pm.

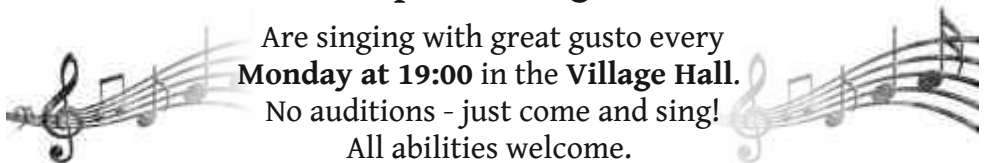
