




Did you know about the Suffolk Mobile Library Service? It visits Hepworth every 4 weeks on a Thursday, and stops at:

From the Rectory

A SUMMER OF REST Dear friends.

As we move into August the lanes are edged with wildflowers, the bees are humming in the churchyard, and the days are lengthening into those beautiful light evenings that feel like a gift. Summer is here.

In one of my favourite films, You've Got Mail, Meg Ryan's character says, "Don't you think daisies are the friendliest flower?" I love that line and I love daisies, especially the beautiful ox-eye daisies that are all around us at the moment. They remind me that some of life's deepest joys are the simplest: the daisies nodding in the fields, children laughing in the sun, a good conversation with a friend under a shady tree.

Summer can be a time when life slows down a little... though I know for some it can still feel busy, with children at home, the garden needing constant attention, visitors arriving, and many of us looking after loved ones. HEPWORTH PARISH COUNCIL - MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HEPWORTH PAVILION - THURSDAY 19 JUNE 2025 @ 1930

PRESENT: Councillor Garry Bloomfield (GB) (Chair), Councillor Nick Bennett (NB), Councillor Louise Robinson (LR)

IN ATTENDANCE: Andy Osman (Parish Clerk) (AO)

- 25/62 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST: GB and NB declared an interest in agenda items 8 a and b, DC/25/0700/LB and DC/25/0699/HH.
- 25/63 APOLOGIES: Cllrs Marjorie MacPherson, Perry Penn and Hollie Williams sent apologies which were accepted.
- 25/64 PUBLIC FORUM: None
- 25/65 REPORTS FROM AND QUESTIONS TO BOTH DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS: County Cllr Spicer reported the following:
 - Weston Lane. County Cllr Spicer, James Pickering (Rights of Way Manager) and Cllr Perry Penn met in May to discuss the ongoing issues. In the short term, Suffolk County Council would organise a 'pick' of the route to remove as much unsuitable material as can reasonably be removed and catalogue the surface of the route with photos. Contact will be made with the British Horse Society to organise another meeting on-site.
 - Bus Shelter Bid. LR reported that she had submitted a bid for a new bus shelter on The Street near to Wood Lane. County Cllr Spicer confirmed that if successful this would be grant funded by Suffolk County Council.
 - Ditch Flooding. The County Farms Manager has confirmed that the tenant farmer was responsible for clearing ditches on The Street alongside county farmland. It was agreed that LR would send County Cllr Spicer the photos of past flooding.
 - District Cllr Bull reported the following: DC/24/1622/FUL. District Cllr Bull confirmed that the case planning officer was aware of Stanton Rides in relation to this application.
- 25/66 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: Minutes of the meeting held on 15 May 2025 had been previously circulated and it was resolved that these were an accurate record of the meetings. County Cllr Spicer left the meeting at 7.58pm
- 25/67 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES: No matters arising
- 25/68 FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION: Finance Report. The meeting noted the finance report (current account balance £8,907.77, savings account balance £7,000.00 and the projected outturn at the end of the FY of approx. £3,200 current account and £7,000 savings account). The following payments were authorised: Clerks Salary & Exps £993.40. It was agreed to seek authorisation from Cllr Louise Robinson for the payment.
- 25/69 PLANNING MATTERS: a. DC/25/0700/LB and DC/25/0699/HH. The

meeting was not able to resolve a position with these two planning applications due to the interests declared at minute 25/62 and the remaining number of councillors present not being quorate for decision making.

b. 'Stables' field. NB commented that the secondary legislation identified by West Suffolk Council to support permitted development at this site also included a clause that prevented development if within 25m of a metalled part of a trunk road or classified road. The meeting agreed that the legislative basis for the development remained unresolved and that the best way forward was for the Parish Council and its planning subject matter advisor to meet with the West Suffolk Council enforcement officer to clear up any misunderstanding. It was agreed that the Clerk was to email to arrange this meeting and also to seek a copy of the policy used to triage enforcement cases. It was also agreed to consider a formal complaint if the meeting request did not lead to clarification on the legal basis for development. District Cllr Bull left the meeting at 8.17pm

25/70 HIGHWAYS MATTERS: No matters discussed.

25/71 CORRESPONDENCE: None

25/72 QUESTIONS TO THE CHAIRMAN: Storm Babet Flood Investigation Form. The meeting noted the flood investigation form sent by the Suffolk County Floods Team seeking detailed information on the flooding that occurred in October 2023 to allow a statutory flood investigation to take place. It was agreed that the Clerk would complete the form in draft, using information saved at the time, ready for the next Parish Council meeting to review and agree. Any further photos, with appropriate geolocation information, should be sent to the Clerk.

25/73 DATE OF NEXT MEETING: It was agreed that the next Parish Council meeting will be on Thursday 17 July 2025 at 7.30 pm.

The meeting closed at 8.25pm.

June 2025: A dry, sunny and exceptionally warm month. The warmest June in my record (2009) with a mean temp. of 19.1°C, +3.6°C above the average and +1.2°C warmer than the previous June record of 17.9°C in June 2023. This record was helped by some very warm nights after the first week of the month. Oppressive and muggy in a moist WSW airstream towards the end of the month.

An appeal for help

St Peter's Church, Hepworth is one of many medieval churches in Suffolk and dates back mainly to the 14 th and 15 th century although there has been a church in the site since the Domesday Survey in 1086. It was reroofed in the late 19 th century, following a fire in the thatched roof. The church now faces a substantial challenge as the roof has begun to leak and we have been advised that it needs completely retiling. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) have set a target of £200,000 to carry out this work.

This is a very large sum for a small village such as Hepworth to raise but there are funds available from charities and organisations. Each has its own application process, which makes raising this money a time consuming process. I have agreed to lead the appeal but I am hoping to recruit a small team to support me. If you are IT savvy, can manipulate online forms and write letters, I would be very grateful for your help.


While the congregation at St Peter's is small, the church is a visible presence in the village and can be seen from a distance. It is a focal point for funerals, baptisms and weddings and sits in our peaceful cemetery. To lose the church would be a tragedy for Hepworth.


